Residential Aged Care Costs

A resident's fees and charges can be made up of the following components:

// Basic Daily Fee

Everyone entering an aged care home is required to pay this fee. The basic daily fee is set by the Government and increases on 20 March and 20 September each year, in line with the changes to the Age Pension. The fee is set at 85% of the single person rate of basic Age Pension.

Set by the Commonwealth Government, it covers the basic living costs such as meals, cleaning, laundry, heating & cooling.

// Accommodation Cost

This is an additional contribution towards the cost of care that some people may be required to pay. Set by Commonwealth Government, Centrelink will work out if you are required to pay this fee based on an assessment of your income and assets and will advise you of the amount.

There are annual and lifetime caps that apply to the means-tested care fee. Any income-tested care fees you have paid in a Home Care Package prior to moving into an aged care home will also contribute to your annual and lifetime caps.

This is for your accommodation in the home. UPA sets a total price for the room, bathroom, facilities and access to all communal areas and you will have a choice of paying the accommodation cost via either:

a) Daily Accommodation Payment (DAP) A fortnightly rental type payment. It is calculated using an interest rate set by the Australian Government. Or

b) Refundable Accommodation Deposit (RAD) Payment of the total room price as a lump sum amount. This amount is refunded when you leave. Or

b) A Combination – Part DAP & Part RAD An initial lump sum payment is made as a portion of the total room price and a daily accommodation payment is calculated on the remaining balance. The daily calculated portion can be paid on a fortnightly basis or be deducted from the lump sum portion.

New residents will have up to 28 days from entering care to nominate which method of payment they prefer. The Daily Accommodation Payment is paid until a decision is made.
