

Key points

- Exclusion recommendations are in place for **certain areas in Sydney and Victoria**

Dear Home Care Service Providers

All home care services must maintain vigilance to prevent the introduction of COVID-19 into the sites where services are provided, as community transmission of COVID-19 continues in some areas of the eastern states. However, in NSW the limited transmission in recent days, has led to some of the recommended restrictions easing. Further declines in incidence of COVID-19 may provide an opportunity to ease current restrictions next week.

Wherever possible residents should be supported to have continued access to essential health and disability supports.

COVID-19 safety measures for home care services

- Minimise staff **working across multiple settings (such as in home and residential care)**. Where ceasing staff movement across settings is not practicable, additional measures should be put in place, such as maintaining records of staff and work locations and increasing use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).
- Ensure a **surgical mask is worn by staff** when caring for clients or where they cannot physically distance from others who work in, reside in, or have visited in the last 14 days:
 - **NSW: Campbelltown LGA, Liverpool LGA and Parramatta LGA**
 - **or a NSW/VIC border community.**
- Ensure staff **actively ask clients about symptoms** on arrival. If staff become aware of a client with symptoms, that client should be isolated from others and arrangements made for COVID-19 testing.

Access restrictions

Exclude all staff from resident contact and home visits who have:

- **fever 37.5°C or higher, or respiratory symptoms²**, even if mild
- **been in Victoria** in the previous 14 days (exceptions exist for staff in **NSW/VIC border communities with a valid border permit**)
- **visited any of the venues** listed on the NSW Government website at the same time as a COVID-19 case (<https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/latest-news-and-updates#self-isolate-and-get-tested-immediately-if-youve-been-to-these-locations>)

¹ Services that support people with disabilities and aged and frail in the community

² Symptoms include: fever, cough, sore/scratchy throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, loss of taste or smell
